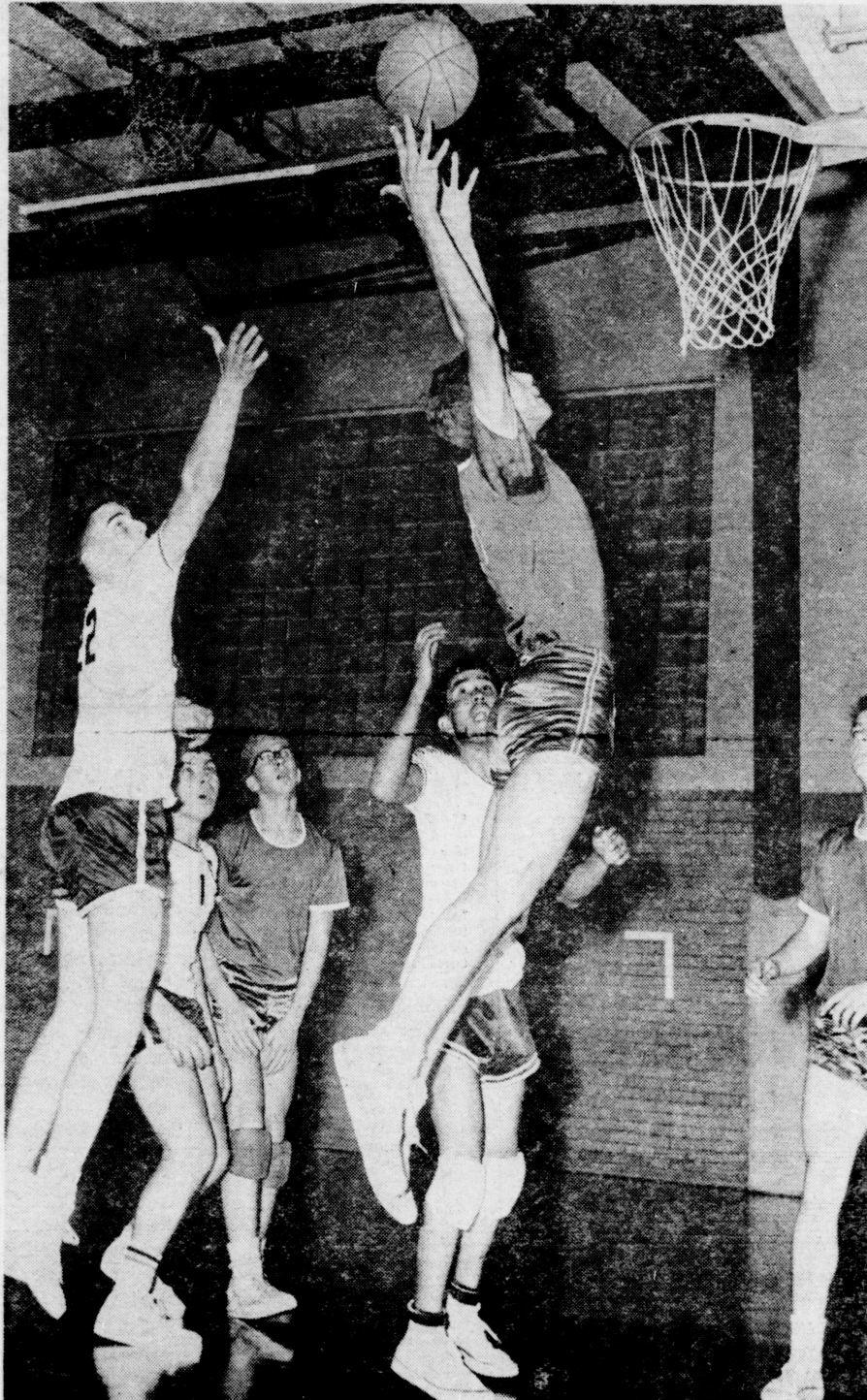

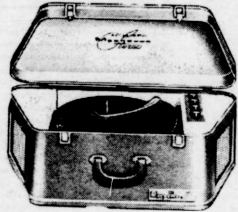

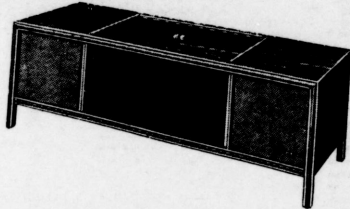

put it to good use!

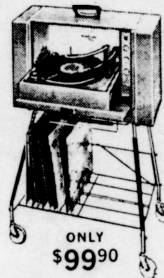
And it could be used for so

# Will The Wildcats Claw Their Way Up?

Last Friday morning William H. Atkinson, director of athletics in the Suffield school system and head basketball coach at Suffield High, said his team's spirit was high and he expected a good year.

Friday evening his Wildcats took to the court against East Granby High in their first outing, played 32 minutes of wide-open basketball, and retired to the locker room with a 97-34 victory, thereby causing some of the Wildcats' wilder fans to conclude that their favorite team might return to the old form which won them a state championship in 1960.

The strong starting five, the reliable bench, the fast break and the height which Atkinson — better known to his charges as "Mr. A" — described Friday morning were all still with the team Friday night. Atkinson himself would be the first to admit that East Granby High was not the most formidable foe his team will face this year. This is only their second year in competition with other schools. Last year, in fact, Atkinson mercifully declined to play them.

Still, 97 points, in high school ball, represents a lot of careful aiming at the peach basket; thus the feelings that Suffield could improve greatly on last year's 2-16 record.

The Wildcats will give a more solid indication of the possible outcome of their future 15 games Friday night, when they play Stafford in a Northern Central Connecticut Conference game at Stafford. Next home game for the team is the following Friday, Dec. 20, against South Windsor, also a league game.

The NCC is in its first year of operation. In addition to Suffield and Stafford, the circuit includes East Windsor, Ellington and South Windsor. Each team will play an eight-game league schedule.

This January will mark the 10th year "Mr. A" has been a coach at Suffield. He took his practice teaching at the

school in 1950, returning four years later as a regular member of the staff. He coached the basketball team until 1960 when he was forced to surrender the sport he loved best to spend more time studying for his Master's degree.

No one can say "Mr. A" left the school coachless, however. Under the direction of Stan Miela, who worked with Atkinson for several years, the team compiled a 24-1 mark and captured the state class S championships. Now Atkinson is rebuilding

Members of the Suffield varsity starting five are: Lee (Moose) Simon, 6'3"; Art (Rocky) Merrill, 5'11"; Bob Flynn, 5'10"; Ray (Auerbach) Manirola, 6'2"; and E. Richard (Daffney) Wolak, 6'2".

All of the starting five are seniors, with the exception of Wolak, a junior. Three of the remaining six also are seniors, so that next year a rebuilding program is going to be necessary.

Reports from junior varsity coach Bob Cecchini are not good, so this would seem the year for the Suffield Wildcats to go on a victory binge, before another likely drought.

# HERITAGE ROAD

BY JOHN TEENE



Two hundred and sixty-nine years ago — in November, 1694 — the first American settler, a man whose name nobody who had made him-

self Somebody came a cropper. William Phips, risen from laborer to Royal Governor of Massachusetts, was dismissed by the Crown.

So ended the original rags-to-riches saga of the New World. Phips faded from sight. In 1695 he died, bitterly disappointed.

But his story remains a triumph. Phips was born in frontier New England of poor

parents. He became a ship's carpenter, a tough, hard-muscled opportunist. He taught himself to read and write. He was a seeker after the main chance. When a well-to-do widow in Boston drifted within his range he promptly married her. Within a few weeks, Phips the carpenter became Phips the ship-building contractor.

He built sturdy vessels for

the Caribbean trade. Shortly he began keeping one or for himself. He took them to sea and turned a neat profit swapping cargoes in Jamaica, Bermuda and Hispaniola. Still he wasn't satisfied.

He wanted a large fortune. He wanted fame and power too.

He got the fortune in a fantastic way. The Caribbean was dotted with shipwrecks — some of the Spanish galleons that had hauled treasure to Europe for a century and a half. They made Phips' mouth water. He sailed to England, talked King James II into giving command of a diving expedition, and found a wreck off Hispaniola. His men brought up gold, silver and jewels, enough to fill twelve ships. Phips sped to England. After he delivered the agreed share to King James, the happy monarch knighted him. The ex-carpenter became the hero of London. A medal was struck in his honor. Even his hostess in the city vied for his presence at her table.

His fortune secure, Phips returned to Boston and built himself a grand brick house. But he wanted glory. When the Massachusetts legislature offered him command of an expedition against the French, he seized it eagerly. In the summer of 1690 he led a bold assault on Acadia (now Nova Scotia). The fort at Port Royal quickly fell. Phips sailed back to Boston and handed over Acadia, captured in less than 40 days, to the colonial officials.

Praises for this ex-laborer rang throughout America. The King of England was in line with public opinion when he appointed Phips to the highest post in the Western Hemisphere, Governor of Massachusetts. For good measure, the Captain-Generalship of the colonies in Connecticut and Rhode Island was thrown in.

Phips rode at the pinnacle. If the success story could be halted here, history would have treated him more kindly. But Phips turned out to be a poor executive.

He was still a combative, opinionated man—with much of the roughneck remaining under the lace collar he wore. He raised taxes to finance expeditions against the French. This angered the taxpayers. He flared back at persons who disagreed with him, no matter how influential the critics. As time went on, he grew less and less patient with even his official advisers.

Finally, he went too far. In 1693 a Jaheel Brenton of Rhode Island was appointed collector of the port of Boston. He seized a cargo owned by a friend of the governor. Furious, Phips descended on the wharf. Words passed between the two men. Phips reverted to the brawler, and Boston was treated to the spectacle of the Royal Representative cursing and fist swinging like a fisherman. A short time later, Phips got into a quarrel with a Captain Short, one of his naval officers. A report states that "at length the governor made use of his cane and broke Short's head."

That was too much for the King. Phips was brought to England to stand trial. He was acquitted. But the first self-made American was nev-

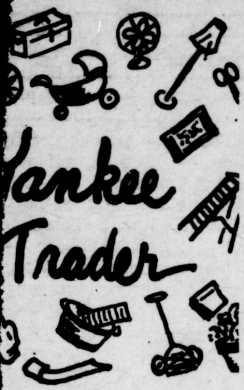

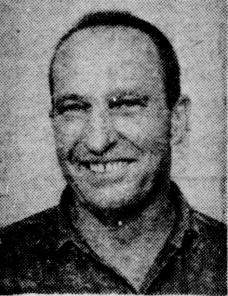

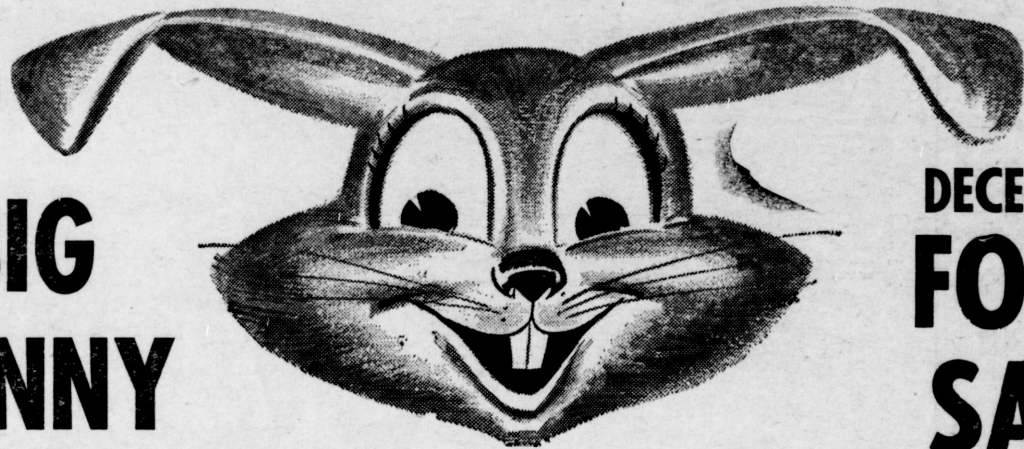
