FACTS ABOUT LEAVES.

As is well known, a tree cannot grow without leaves. The leaves are the lungs of the tree, and are a contrivance for vastly increasing the surface. An oak tree of good size exposes several acres of surface to the air during the growing season. It has been estimated that the Washington elm at Cambridge, Mass., not a very large tree, exposes to the air five acres of leaves. Leaves are more nearly comparable to stomachs than lungs. A leaf is a laboratory for assimilating or manufacturing raw materials into plant fabric. The cellular structure of the leaves, wood and bark of a tree is a complicated subject to treat in a popular way. It requires a vast surface of leaves to do a little work. By counting the leaves on a seedling oak, and estimating the surface of both sides of each, we can see how many inches are needed to build up roots and stem for the first year. After the first year the old stem of the oak bears no leaves. It is dependent on the leaves of the branches, or its children, for support. A tree is a sort of community, each part having its own duties to perform. The root has taken up most nutriment, and the young roots take this to the larger ones, and they in turn, like the branches of a river, pour the food of crude sap into the trunk, which conveys it to the assimilated or digested sap passes from the leaves to all growing parts of the plant, and the food is made there. The winds give a tree exercise, which seems good to help make it strong. Our toughest wood comes from trees growing in exposed places. The limbs of a tree are all the time striving with each other to see which limb will be the most roomy and the most sunshine. While some perish in the attempt, or meet with very different success, the strongest of the strong buds survive.

PHOTOGRAPHS IN NATURAL COLORS.

A photographer at Versailles (France), is said to have invented a method of taking photographs which retain the colors of the scene reflected on the lens. Similar discoveries have previously been announced from Germany and England. It was said some years ago that a photographer in Dorchester (Eng.) had the secret, and he was eventually obliged to sell for a small sum well-ventilated colored photographic copies of pictures. It was understood, however, that there was some after process—probably meant that the copies, when taken in the ordinary way, were simply painted by hand in a way which was not at all extraordinary. It is difficult to understand how any other result could be obtained. A photograph is practically a detailed shadow, and that a photograph could be taken which should preserve the green of the trees, the blue of the flowers, and the blue of the sky, together with the tint of dresses, and all such like matters, seems incredible. So many things which have seemed incredible have nevertheless come to pass; there are so many things in heaven and earth that have been dreamed of in no man's philosophy that it would be unduly nice to deny the possibility of what the Versailles photographer claims. It is to be feared, however, that on investigation the Frenchman will prove to be no nearer the mark than his German and English predecessors in the attempt to discover a secret which would revolutionize not only photography, but pictorial art altogether.

HOW ASTOR BECAME RICH.

A recent writer, speaking of the late John Jacob Astor, thus speaks of the mode by which he acquired his great wealth. It was neither furs nor tea that gave him twenty million dollars. When he arrived in New York it contained only twenty-five thousand inhabitants. In 1809, when he had begun to have money to invest, the city had begun to double its population, and had advanced nearly a mile up the island. Astor foresaw the future growth, and bought all the lands and lots just beyond the verge of the city that he could get. One little anecdote will show the wisdom of this proceeding. He saw a lot in the vicinity of Wall street, in 1810, for eight thousand dollars, which was supposed to be somewhat under its value. The purchaser, after the papers were signed, seemed to chuckle over his bargain. "Why, Mr. Astor," said he, "this lot will be worth twenty thousand dollars." "Very true," replied Mr. Astor, "but you shall see what I shall do with this money. With eight thousand dollars I will buy eighty lots above Canal street. By the time you lot is worth twelve thousand dollars my eighty lots will be worth eighty thousand dollars." Which proved to be the fact. In the course of time the island was dotted all over with Astor lands to such an extent that the whole income from his estate for fifty years could be invested in new houses, without buying any more land.
