THE PAMPAS. The peculiar characteristics of these vast plains, which descend from the Andes to the great river basin in northern Uruguay, are the absence of rivers or streams, and the peculiar occurrence of droughts, or "siecos," in the summer months. These conditions determine the singular character both of its flora and fauna.

A nearly perfect skeleton of the moeasurus was recently discovered in a quarry near Mons, in the Province of Hainaut, Belgium. It has the external diameter of fifty-five feet nine inches. It is to be preserved in the National History Museum, Brussels.

Many pots of preserved fruits put up by a firm of Rouen were ascertained to contain from 150 to 600 grams of salicylic acid per kilogram. But the acid had failed to prevent either fermentation or the formation of mold on the surface of the contents of the pots.

Statistics show that in a single decade the population of New-South Wales has increased nearly thirty per cent, that the number of children receiving instruction in the schools has more than trebled, and that the number of mills and manufactories has been quadrupled.

Efforts made by the National Fish Culture Association, England, to acclimatize the American whitefish (Coregonus) have met with most encouraging results. Many of those which had been hatched at Kent Kensington, after their transportation to the ponds at Delaford, thrived remarkably well.

It is stated that since carmine has been abandoned in favor of eosine reds painful spots on the skin and eczema have become common among girls employed in making red artificial flowers. The eosine lakes used have a lead base, and the substitution of aluminum lakes has been recommended by a leading chemical authority.

MM. Crova and Garbe claim to have discovered a means of determining and automatically recording the exact amount of energy afforded in electric accumulators and so regulating the discharge as to be able to ascertain the quantity still held in reserve at any given moment. The machines used in their experiments were of the Plate storage type as modified by Faure.

At a recent meeting of the Society of Arts, London, Mr. Parker said that petroleum had been accidentally discovered at a place near Grenoble by chance visitor who had resided in the American petroleum districts. The whole of the land about the place has been bought and the workings for the oil are now in progress. At a depth of 190 meters the quantity of gas was increasing, and hopes were entertained that Grenoble and other towns can be lighted with it.

Experiments made under the direction of the administration of the Dutch State railways with various paints on iron plates are reported to have proved that the red lead paints resist atmospheric influences much better than those of brown-red and iron oxides. The red lead paints adhered closer to the metal, and possessed greater elasticity than the others. It was also found that better results were obtained if, before the paints were applied, the plates were pickled, instead of being merely scraped and brushed. The test plates were pickled in muriatic acid, washed with water, thoroughly dried, and, while warm, thoroughly oiled.

In his instructions relating to sewer construction, Sir R. Rowfinson observes that Portland cement and lime makes make good hydraulic mortar. The proportion of cement or lime to sand should not exceed two and a half parts of clean, sharp sand to one part, by measure of volume. If the concrete is to be of lime, the mortar should be of clean sand and one-half part of ash or slag employed, the whole to be mixed in a revolving pan, each panful to have twenty minutes' grinding. In making mortar or concrete it is of the utmost importance to use clean materials. The water for wetting bricks and for mixing mortar or concrete ought to be free from salt.

A vase has been found during the course of some excavations in a burying ground at Metopontum with a Greek alphabet of the Archaic omicron, of Sicily. Signor Barnabei, of Rome, considers this vase to be one of the most important archaeological discoveries that have been made in recent times. The vase is in perfect preservation, and its form indicates that it belongs to a period as far back as 300 B. C. In the annular space surrounding the raised rim the letters of the most important archaic omicron alphabet are inscribed, and are identical with those of the vase actually introduced into Italy by the Greeks.

Just as the frozen soil preserves in its bosom, through long, cheerless days of winter, seeds which shall afterward clothe the earth in beauty and fill the air with fragrance, so did the non-progressive institutions of the Dark Ages cherish the germs, already budded into form, which were long to burst the crust of superstitions' ignorance, and come forth fresh and sweet in the spring-time of intellectual awakening.

Of modern times cannot be too grateful to the excellent and diligent work of those early days, who have bequeathed to us so rich a treasure. Nearly all that is valuable in revelation, in history, in theology, in science, art and government—in fact, the great bulk of literature of every kind belonging to the dawn of the Christian era, has come down to us through the medium of monks and anchorites of the early church.

Nor has the crypt preserved for us sacred literature alone, but also a large portion of immortal writings of profane literature. The histories of Tacitus gathered that in a monk's cell long before they were given to the world. Some of Cicero's dissertations along with the vine twigs of an ancient monastery till they were so discovered that only the same-eyed medical schoolmen could make them out. Livy's manuscripts were found in a monk's closet, so were Aristotle's. Truly, the strongholds of the venerable fathers were keeps of which the world may well be proud since they sheltered Aristotle and Cicero, and Tacitus, Livy, and scores of other immortal writers from the devastating hand of barbarism.

Duty of every kind has in it the elements of pleasure, and if we do not discover and appropriate them it is our own fault.
