THE SEVENTEENTH'S REUNION.

HISTORY OF THE REUNION.

The Seventeenth Regiment Connecticut Volunteers was for the most part furnished by Fairfield County, and recruited in the month of May, 1862.

On the 23d of May, 1888, the regiment was called upon to participate in the battle of Gettysburg. It was the only regiment of the Army of the Potomac which was present at the battle.

The loss in this engagement was one hundred and twenty-seven officers and men. Among the wounded were Colonel Noble, Captain Hobbs, Co. B, and Lieutenant Blinn, Co. D.

After nearly twelve months of service with the Army of the Potomac, the regiment was, in August, 1862, transferred to the Department of the South, and located at Fort Lytle, S. C.

On the 23d of February, 1864, the regiment sailed from Fort Lytle to Jacksonville, Fla. During the month of March, it was attached to the 1st Brigade, "Ames' Division," of General Seymour's command.

On the 24th of December, Colonel Noble was captured by the enemy while on his march from Jacksonville to St. Augustine. He was held in a stockade for several months.

Major Allen, in his report dated March 1st, 1865, remarks: "The brave young Captain Caldwell fell through and through the body. He was in the act of cutting his way through the rebels when he received a mortal wound."
