A New Article of Food.

There has recently been introduced upon the market a new article known as crushed white wheat, and from the rapidity with which it has become known, it would seem that the old white bread, as well as the new, are being displaced, and people learn to use Nature's products, as they were designed to be used.

Above all the products of the earth, wheat would appear to be most eminently the food for mankind, inasmuch as it contains all the elements found in the human body, and, if properly used, affords nourishment to both mind and body. Hence bread has always been denominated the staff of life, but ignorance and prejudice has so interfered with its preparation, that the name is a misnomer and no longer applicable. Bread, as at present made from bolted flour, contains but little else than starch; and though the article is a valuable element in the human body, its constant use, without the other elements of the grain, is apt to prove more injurious than salutary. The housekeepers of the present day demand the white flour, that will produce the whitest bread, and to provide them with it the wheat is robbed of its most valuable elements. Nutrition is sacrificed to appearance, and an inferior article of food is produced, which is almost positively harmful. In boiling the flour to make it pure white, the bran or outer crust of the berry is removed, and with it is taken upwards of 90 per cent. of the most essential life-sustaining elements it contains. The bran contains the nitrates, or those elements which go to make the muscles of the body, and closely adhering to it are the carbonates, which prevent heat and fat, and also the phosphates of lime and soda, of which bones are made, and which nourish the nerves and brain. It will, therefore, be seen that this is the most valuable part of the berry, and that when it is lost nothing is left but the central mass, which is composed principally of starch. In boiling the flour the starch is carefully preserved and the other valuable elements of the berry thrown away as an inferior article. The fine grinding of the flour is also to be deprecated, for the phosphates are extremely volatile, and when existing in such minute atoms are apt to disappear before they can be taken into the system. These facts should prove conclusively that the entire berry should be used for food, and no part of it wasted. This can only be accomplished by the use of the crushed white wheat manufactured by Messrs. F. E. Smith & Co., of the Atlantic Flour Mills, Brooklyn, for which only the finest quality of wheat is used, and which contains all the nutriment of the berry. Crushed white wheat, it must be remembered, is quite a different manufacture from ordinary white wheat, or any other whole wheat preparation, and should not be confounded with other articles. Grocers will find it a most saleable article, and its general use in families will be found to contribute more to good health than any other agency.

SOAKING SEEDS.—Many persons delay the sowing of vegetable seeds until rather late in the season and then try to make it up by soaking for a few hours or sprouting before being put into the ground. This is a kind of make shift system that rarely proves satisfactory, for several good reasons or causes. If the sprouting of seeds commences before sowing they must be placed in soil sufficiently warm and moist to insure a continuance of growth; for the least check is sure to destroy vitality. We do not condemn the usual practice of soaking seeds in order to hasten growth, by any means where there is a possibility of gaining time by the operation, but only wish to remind our readers that there is more to be lost than gained in doing it, unless precautionary measures are taken to supply the growing seeds with moisture after being put into the ground. Frequently we have a drought of longer or shorter duration after the first dash of spring rains are over, and this usually comes just in time to catch the late sown seeds. The safest plan with all seeds which will not readily rot in rather wet, cold ground, like peas, lettuce, tomatoes, beets and spinach, is to sow early and let them sprout in their own good time, which will always be as early as the weather permits. It is also to be remembered that any seeds sown too early in the season, cold water from a well or spring should not be applied until warmed a little; therefore some old hogsheads or tanks may be prepared now and be put in a convenient place into which the water can be stored for use. A warm sunny spot by the side of some outbuilding, will answer the purpose very well; and we are quite sure the time and expense of preparing these receptacles will not be wasted.

PREPARING WHITEWASH.—The season of the year has returned when the inquiries for good whitewash are raised. We give the following as excellent: Take half a bushel of good burnt lime, slake it with boiling water, cover it during the process to keep in the steam. Strain the liquor through a fine sieve, add to it seven pounds of soft, purified well dissolved in warm water, three pounds of ground rice, mix to a thin paste and stirred in boiling hot, one-half pound of Spanish whiting, and one pound of clean glue, which has been previously dissolved by soaking it well, and then hanging it over a slow fire, in a small kettle within a large one filled with water. Add five gallons of hot water to the mixture, stir in well and let it stand a few days covered from dirt. For this purpose it can be kept on a portable furnace. About one pint of this mixture will cover a square yard.

TO CLEAN PAINT.—A correspondent of the Country Gentleman says: Use but little water at once; keep it warm and clean by changing it often. A flannel cloth takes off all fly specks better than cotton. Soap will remove the paint so use but little of it. Cold tea is the best liquor for cleaning washed paint, window panes and mirrors. A mixture of diluted acetic acid is always to be had on hand to clean away washed paint that has become badly smeared; it is better than soap. Never put soap upon glass unless it can be thoroughly rinsed off, which can never be done to window glass. Wash off the specks with warm tea and rub the panes dry; then make a paste of whiting and water, and put a little in the center of each pane. Take a dry cloth and rub it all over the glass, then rub it off with a clean cloth or flannel.


