PUBLIC ACT

OF THE STATE OF CONNECTICUT. PASSED AT THE JANUARY SESSION OF THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY, 1878. (Published by Authority.)

Section 1. Every owner or keeper of a dog or dogs shall annually, on or before the first day of May in each year, cause said dog or dogs to be registered, numbered, described and licensed for one year in the town clerk's office in the town wherein said dog or dogs are kept or harbored, and shall keep under his neck a collar distinctly marked with its owner's name and its registered number, and shall pay of said dog or dogs the sum of two dollars and fifty cents for each male, and six dollars and fifty cents for each female dog.

Section 2. Any dog not so licensed and not licensed as provided in this act may be lawfully killed by any person, and such person killing said dog and presenting satisfactory proof thereof to either the selectmen or the town clerk of the town wherein such dog was killed.

Section 3. The town clerk of said town shall issue said licenses and receive the money therefor, and after deducting fifteen cents for each and every dog so licensed, shall pay the same to the treasurer of the town within thirty days thereafter.

Section 4. That any person owning or keeping a dog or dogs who shall fail to comply with the requirements of this act concerning the registration of said dog or dogs, and shall be guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof shall be fined not more than seven dollars or imprisoned not more than thirty days, or both.

PUBLIC ACT

OF THE STATE OF CONNECTICUT. PASSED AT THE JANUARY SESSION OF THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY, 1878. (Published by Authority.)

Section 1. Every owner or keeper of a dog or dogs shall annually, on or before the first day of May in each year, cause said dog or dogs to be registered, numbered, described and licensed for one year in the town clerk's office in the town wherein said dog or dogs are kept or harbored, and shall keep under his neck a collar distinctly marked with its owner's name and its registered number, and shall pay of said dog or dogs the sum of two dollars and fifty cents for each male, and six dollars and fifty cents for each female dog.

Section 2. Any dog not so licensed and not licensed as provided in this act may be lawfully killed by any person, and such person killing said dog and presenting satisfactory proof thereof to either the selectmen or the town clerk of the town wherein such dog was killed.

Section 3. The town clerk of said town shall issue said licenses and receive the money therefor, and after deducting fifteen cents for each and every dog so licensed, shall pay the same to the treasurer of the town within thirty days thereafter.

Section 4. That any person owning or keeping a dog or dogs who shall fail to comply with the requirements of this act concerning the registration of said dog or dogs, and shall be guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof shall be fined not more than seven dollars or imprisoned not more than thirty days, or both.
