The following are extracts from a lecture entitled "Gleanings from Fuller's Field" delivered several weeks ago in this city.

"I was born in Vermont near the Canada line, Jan. 20, 1811. At the age of seventeen our family removed to the wilds of Devon county New York, and after much privation and hardship we succeeded in clearing up a farm on which we were living at the time of my departure for the ministry."

My first circuit was traveled over on horseback, I then received an annual salary of thirty-six dollars. While preaching here one evening the saddle was taken from my horse, despoiled of its washing, and filled with stones.

The saddle was a horseman's one and entirely spoiled, which I returned with fifteen dollars deducted from my yearly stipend of thirty-six dollars.

At another time I was invited to stay over night with a good brother when coming his way, and invited to retire upon a rude bed made from the boughs of a tree, by being covered with boards and straw with a plentiful supply of rag carpet for coverlets.

It was snowing at the time, and amid the fury of the storm, the door was opened, and a man, who had been lying in bed, had barricaded the door and turned into bed. After awhile I fell asleep, and awoke in the morning to find my bed covered with a beautiful white counterpane of snow about five inches thick, and my hands and feet badly frozen-bitten, and my hair frozen solid with ice.

When near Poughkeepsie, I undertook a visit to a locality not bearing a very exalted name for kindness or hospitality. The first house I entered I found a nice sweet looking lady, who looked so nice that I thought there was no devil in a thousand miles of her.
